## Market Alerts

### Recommended Items to Avoid



HURRICANE FLORENCE UPDATE North and South Carolina, Georgia, Eastern Tennessee and southern Virginia are all potentially impacted by Florence's heavy rain and wind. Crops that may be affected in the near future include **Sweet Potatoes**, Fall Squash, Cucumbers, Eggplant and Tomatoes. Be sure to read the Produce Market Advisory for up-to-date information.



**ORANGES 113 CT and smaller Oranges** are very scarce, and will continue to be through the end of October when the Navel season begins and the Valencia season ends. **88 CT and larger sizes** are plentiful. Quality is fair to poor on all sizes and grades, with softness, mold and decay all reported. Consider **Apples** or **Stone Fruit** as a hand fruit alternative.



**LEMONS** The prolonged shortage of **Lemons** is beginning to ease, now that new growing areas in southern California and Arizona are ramping up. Supplies are 2-3 weeks away from returning to normal. Pricing remains higher than normal on all grades and sizes, with fair quality.



**CUCUMBERS** The initial harvest out of Baja California is very light, and available product is not keeping up with demand. Pricing remains up to 30% higher than normal in the western half of the U.S. Quality is fair, and Select-grade product is the best value.



**AVOCADOS** Supplies out of Mexico remain light. Pricing is higher than normal, with good quality reported. 48 or 60 CT, #2 grade product is the best value.



**BERRIES** Harvest transition in California, Michigan and the Pacific Northwest has tightened supplies of **Strawberries**, **Blueberries** and **Blackberries**. Quality is good, but pricing may be higher in certain markets.

## MARKET OPPORTUNITIES

**Pears:** New crop Bartlett, Bosc and Red Pears are all being harvested out of California and Washington. Quality is excellent, with firm fruit and good sweetness.



**Apples:** New crop varietals are being harvested out of Washington, Michigan and New York, including Ginger Gold, Gala and Macintosh.



**Potatoes:** New crop Idaho potatoes are now in season. Quality and pricing are very good.



**Grapes:** Quality is excellent, with great texture and sweetness, on Red and Green medium-sized fruit.



**Melons:** Quality is outstanding on Cantaloupe and Honeydew out of Southern California, with very good sugar levels. Pricing is also very good.

### A Peek at Peak Seasons

The local growing season for most of the U.S. is heating up. Look for these most commonly harvested products in the following regions, and be sure to ask your distributor for locally grown recommendations!

**Northeast/Mid-Atlantic** – Apples, Root Vegetables, Corn, Kale, Lettuce, Peppers, Fall Squash

**Southeast** – Beans, Cabbage, Corn, Cucumbers, Greens, Sweet Potatoes

Midwest - Peppers, Cucumbers, Celery, Corn, Apples, Fall Squash

Pacific Northwest – Apples Pears, Potatoes, Berries, Lettuce, Fall Squash

Southwest – Corn, Okra, Potatoes, Squash, Sweet Potatoes, Melons

## Weather Update

**California:** Temperatures will warm to above normal again in Central California's inland regions, with cooler temps to the south.

**Mexico:** Seasonal temperatures and precipitation in most growing regions.

**Southeastern U.S.:** Hurricane Florence will impact North and South Carolina, Georgia, Eastern Tennessee and southern Virginia with heavy rain and high winds. Florida is expected to avoid its most significant effects.
